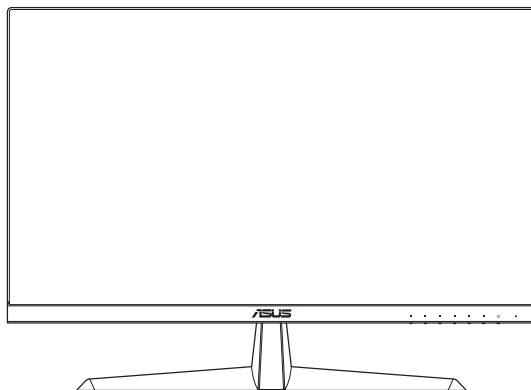

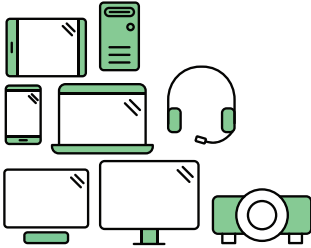

# Care & Cleaning

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.
- Cleaning. Turn your monitor off and unplug the power cord. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the LCD. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside the monitor and cause an electric shock.

## The following symptoms are normal with the monitor:

- The screen may flicker during the initial use due to the nature of the fluorescent light. Turn off the Power Switch and turn it on again to make sure that the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!

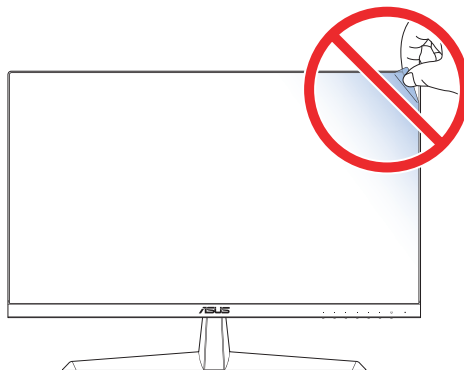

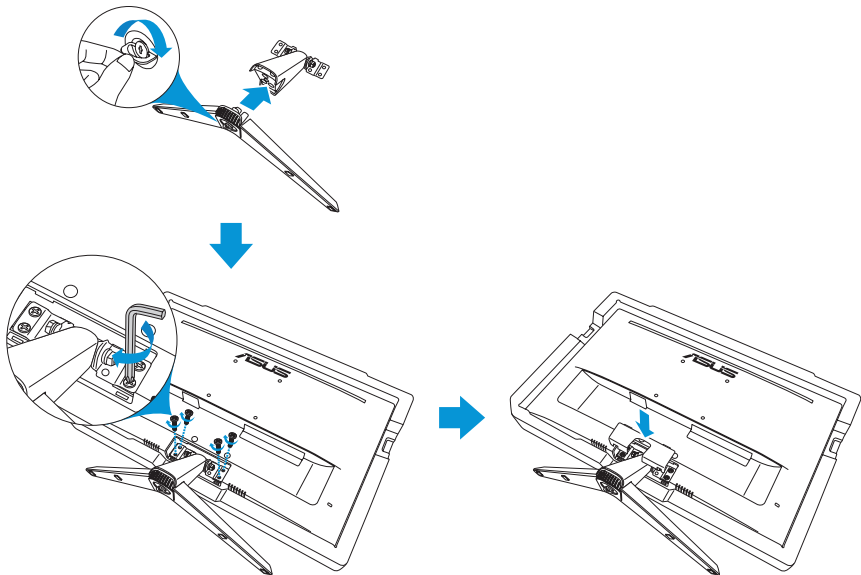


## 1.3 Assembling the Monitor Base

1. Carefully place the monitor on the EPS foam, with the screen facing down.
2. Attach the base to the arm.
3. Lift the screw ring and turn it clockwise to secure the base.
4. Place the arm hinge of the the stand assembly onto its compartment on the rear of the monitor. Then use the L-shaped screwdriver to secure it with four screws.
5. Install the stand cover to the rear of the monitor.

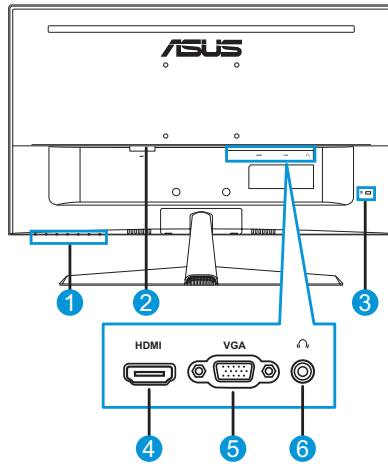

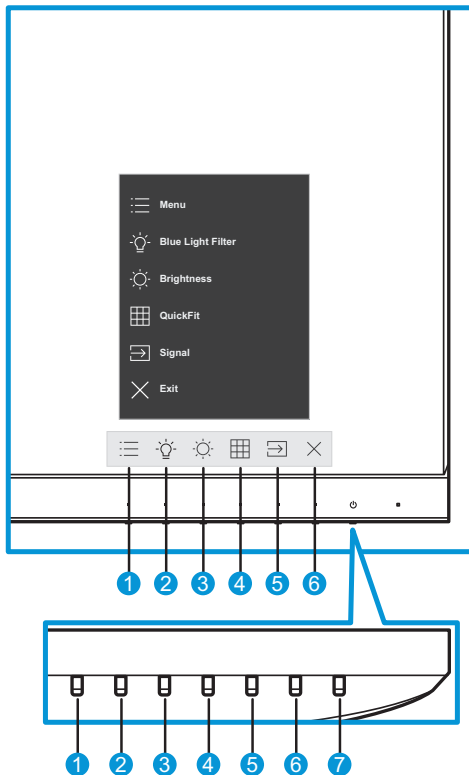

# 1.5 Monitor Introduction

## 1.5.1 Using the Control Buttons

Use the control buttons on the bottom of the monitor to adjust the image settings. Press key 1-6 to activate the key list page.



- ☰ Menu Button:
  - Enter the OSD menu.
  - Press the button for more than five seconds to activate the key lock function. To unlock, press the button again for more than five seconds.
- 💡 Shortcut Key1:
  - This is a Shortcut key. The default setting is **Blue Light Filter** with 0.

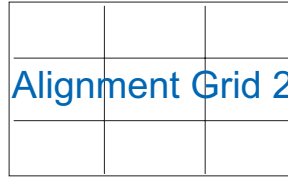
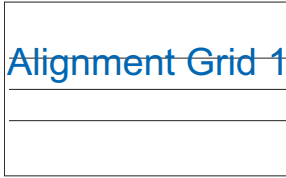
3.  Shortcut Key2:
  - This is a Shortcut key. The default setting is **Brightness**.
4.  QuickFit Button:
  - This is a hotkey to activate the **QuickFit** function designed for alignment.
  - The **QuickFit** function contains several options of common grid pattern, paper size, and photo size. See page 1-6 for details.
5.  Input Button:
  - Switch the input source.
6.  Close Button:
  - Exit the OSD menu.
7.  Power Button/Power Indicator:
  - Press this button to turn the monitor on/off.

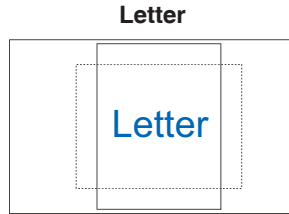
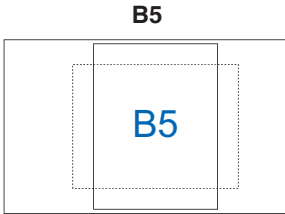
## 1.5.2 QuickFit Function

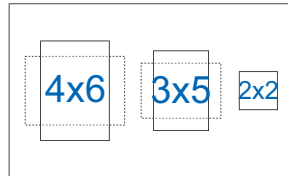
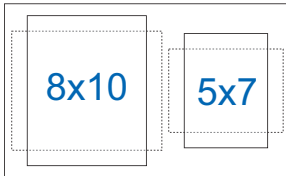
- Grid pattern: Facilitates designers and users to organize content and layout on one page and achieve a consistent look and feel.



- Paper size: Provides users to view their documents in real size on the screen.







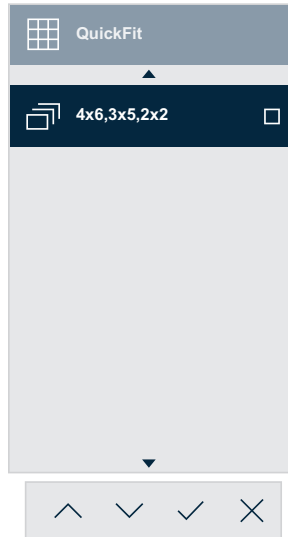
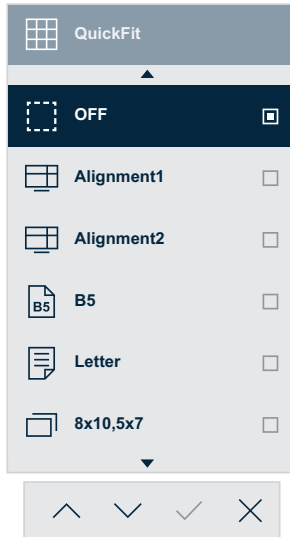

## 1.5.4 GamePlus Function

The GamePlus Function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games. The Crosshair overlay with four different crosshair options lets you choose the one that best suits the game you're playing. The onscreen Timer can be positioned on the left of the display to keep track of the elapsed gaming time. The FPS (frames per second) counter lets you know how smooth the game is running.



## 2.1 Detaching the Base (for VESA Wall Mount)

To detach the base, perform the following:

1. Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully place the monitor on the EPS foam, with the screen facing down.
2. Remove the stand cover.
3. Use the L-shaped screwdriver to remove the four screws. Then remove the stand assembly.
4. Remove the four rubber pads. Then align and install the wall mount bracket on the rear of the monitor.



- We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.
- Hold the base while removing the screw.



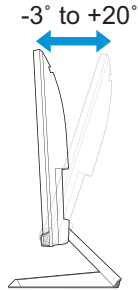
- The VESA wall mount kit ( 100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
- Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 22.7kg (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm).



## 2.2 Adjusting the Monitor

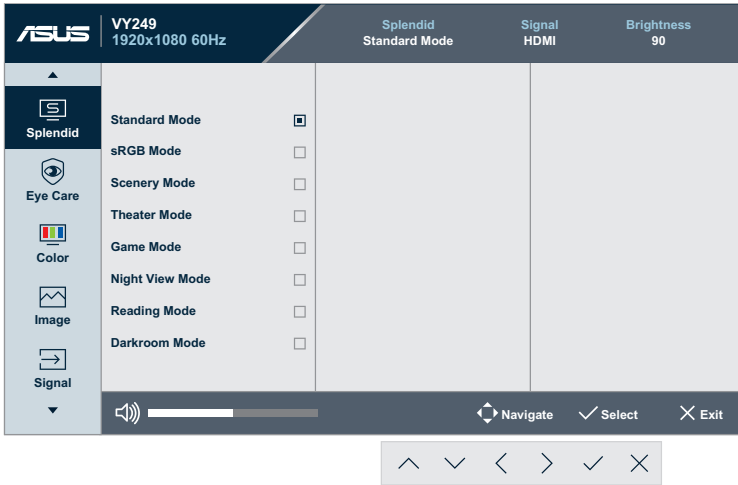
- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling while changing its angle.
















You can adjust the monitor's angle from  $-3^{\circ}$  to  $20^{\circ}$ .



## 3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) Menu

### 3.1.1 How to Reconfigure

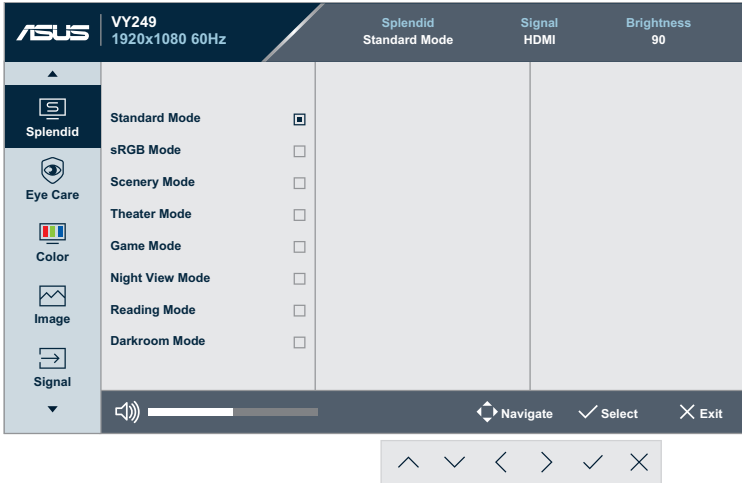


1. Press the  button to activate the OSD menu. See page 1-4 for details.
2. Press the  or  button to toggle between options in the Menu. As you move from one icon to another, the option name is highlighted.
3. Press the  or  button to enter its submenu.
4. Press the  or  button to select the desired option.
  - If the selected option has its submenu, press the  or  button to enter the submenu. Then use the , ,  or  button, according to the indicators on the bottom of the menu, to make your changes.
5. Press the  button to confirm the selection or press the  button to return to the previous menu.

## 3.1.2 OSD Function Introduction

### 1. Splendid

This function contains eight sub-functions that you can select for your preference.



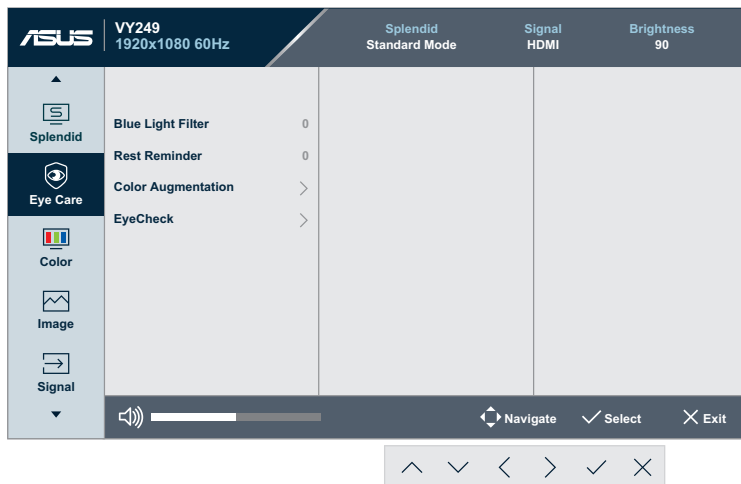
- **Standard Mode:** This is the best choice for document editing with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- **sRGB Mode:** In this mode, the system will automatically utilize the settings of Gamma2.2, D65 color temperature, brightness 100 nits, and sRGB color space which is the best choice for viewing photos and graphics from PCs.
- **Scenery mode:** This is the best choice for scenery photo displaying with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- **Theater Mode:** This is the best choice for movie watching with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- **Game Mode:** This is the best choice for game playing with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- **Night View Mode:** This is the best choice for playing dark-scene game or watching dark-scene movie with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- **Reading Mode:** This is the best choice for book reading with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- **Darkroom Mode:** This is the best choice for a weak ambient light environment with SPLENDID™ Video Intelligence Technology.



- In the Standard Mode, the Saturation, Skin Tone, Sharpness, and ASCR functions are not user-configurable.
- In the sRGB, the Saturation, Color Temp., SkinTone, Sharpness, Brightness, Contrast, and ASCR functions are not user-configurable.
- In the Reading Mode, the Saturation, SkinTone, ASCR, Contrast, and Color Temp. functions are not user-configurable.

## 2. Eye Care

In this function, you can adjust settings to better protect your eyes.



- **Blue Light Filter:** In this function, you can adjust the blue light filter from 0 to max.
  - 0: No changes.
  - Max: The higher the level, the less blue light is scattered. When blue light filter is activated, the default settings of Standard Mode will be automatically imported. Besides maximum level, the brightness is user-configurable. Maximum is the optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV low blue light certification\*. The brightness function is not user configurable.



- 
- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours: It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more effective than a single longer break.
  - To minimize eye strain and dryness in your eyes, users should rest the eye periodically by focusing on objects that are far away.
  - Eye exercises can help to reduce eye strain. Repeat these exercises often.  
If eye strain continues, please contact a physician.  
Eye exercises: (1) Repeating look up and down (2) Slowly roll your eyes (3) Move your eyes diagonal.
  - High energy blue light may lead to eye strain and AMD(Age-Related Macular Degeneration). Blue light Filter reduces 70% (max.) harmful blue light to avoid CVS(Computer Vision Syndrome) when the user adjusts the blue light filter bar to the maximum level.
  - \*The color augmentation is set to its default value (50).
  - When the level is set to maximum, the **Brightness** option in **Color** menu will be disabled.

- **Rest Reminder:** This function provides you a rest reminder according to how long you set for your working time.  
For example, a user sets 30 minutes working time and there will be a pop up reminder appeared on the upper left corner of the monitor for 5 seconds. Press any key to make this reminder OSD disappeared.

- When this function is enabled, the following functions are not available: Splendid Demo Mode, GamePlus, and QuickFit.

- **Color Augmentation:** The adjusting range of color enhancement is from 0 to 100.

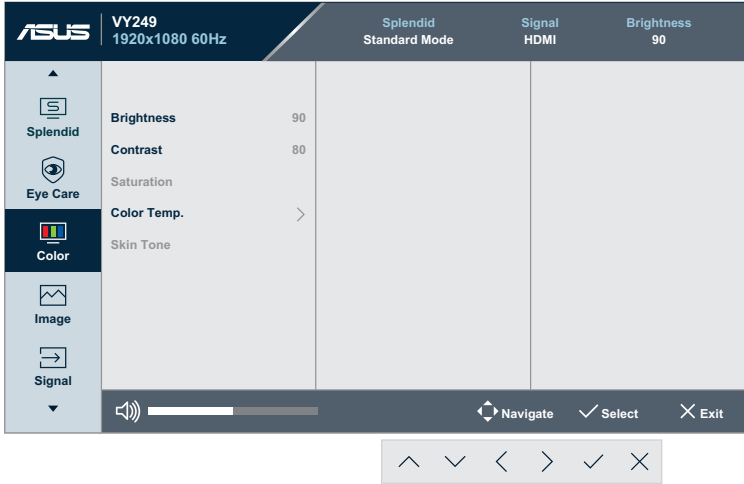

- This function is not available in sRGB mode under Splendid.
  - This function is also not available in reddish and yellowish in skin tone. In other words, the **Color Augmentation** option grays out when reddish or yellowish is selected. It activates when natural under skin tone is selected.

- **EyeCheck:** This function can assist you with the eyes examination using the three patterns. See page 1-8 for details.

### 3. Color

Select the image color you like from this function.



- **Brightness:** Adjust the brightness level. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Contrast:** Adjust the contrast level. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Saturation:** Adjust the saturation level. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Color Temp.:** Select the desired color temperature. Available options: **Cool, Normal, Warm, and User Mode.**



- In the User Mode, colors of R (Red), G (Green), and B (Blue) are user-configurable; the adjusting range is from 0 ~ 100.

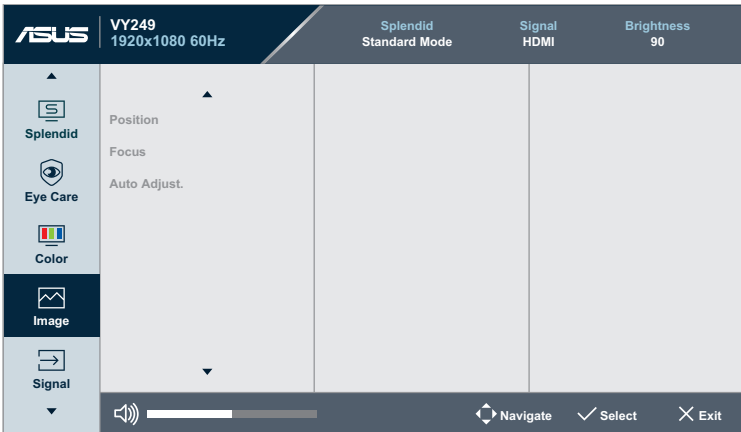
- **Skin Tone:** Select the desired skin color. Available options: **Reddish, Natural, and Yellowish.**

#### 4. Image

You can adjust the image Sharpness, Trace Free, Aspect Control, VividPixel, ASCR, Motion Sync, AMD FreeSync, Shadow Boost, Position, Focus, and Auto Adjust. from this main function.



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- **Sharpness:** Adjust the picture sharpness. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.

- **Trace Free:** Speed up the response time by Over Drive technology. The adjusting range is from lower 0 to faster 100.
- **Aspect Control:** Adjust the aspect ratio to “Full”, “4:3”, or “OverScan”.



- 4:3 is only available when the input source is in 4:3 format.
  - OverScan is only available for HDMI input.
- 

- **VividPixel:** ASUS Exclusive Technology that brings lifelike visuals for crystal-clear and detail-oriented enjoyment. The adjusting range is from 0~100.
- **ASCR:** Select **ON** or **OFF** to enable or disable dynamic contrast ratio function.
- **Motion Sync:** Offer a more clear mode while displaying motion pictures. Please note this function only works when the refresh rate is 75Hz. It includes two modes: Normal Mode and Advanced Mode, which can provide different effects.



- When this function is enabled, the system will automatically reduce the brightness level.
  - If the AMD FreeSync is enabled, the Motion Sync function is grayed out.
- 

- **AMD FreeSync:** Allows an AMD FreeSync supported graphics source (HDMI) to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and low-latency display update.



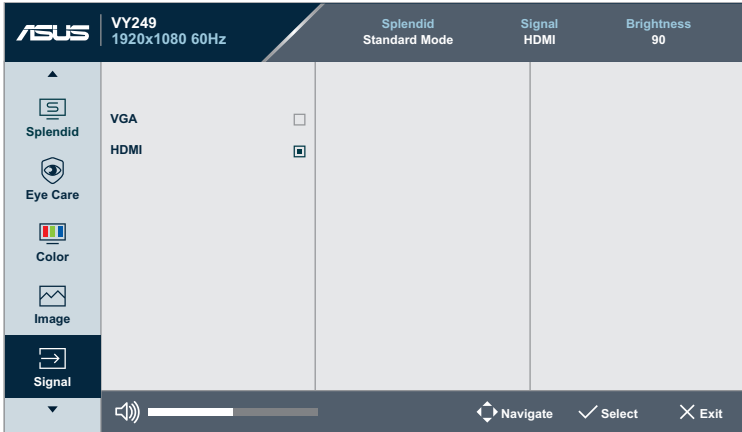
- If the Motion Sync is enabled, the AMD FreeSync function is grayed out.

- **Shadow Boost:** Dark color enhancement adjusts the monitor gamma curve to enrich the dark tones in an image making dark scenes and objects much easier to be found.
- **Position:** Adjust the horizontal position (H-Position) and the vertical position (V-Position) of the image. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100 (only available for VGA input).
- **Focus:** Reduce the Horizontal-line noise and Vertical-line noise of the image by adjusting (Phase) and (Clock) separately. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100 (only available for VGA input).
- **Auto Adjust.:** Automatically perform Auto Adjust (only available for VGA input).
