Front View

· Proximity sensor

- Turns off the screen and disables touch functionality when the device is in close proximity to the body.
- Turns the screen back on and enables touch functionality when the device is outside a specific range from the body.

Power key

- Press to turn the screen on or off.
- Press and hold to select a power control option.

Volume keys

- Adjust the volume of your device's sounds and audio playback. For more information, see <u>"Volume" on page 106</u>.
- In the camera app, press a volume key to take a photo.

Set Up Your Device

Learn how to set up your device for the first time.

Assemble Your Device

Install a SIM card (if supported) and optional memory card (not included), and charge your device before using.

Remove the Back Cover

Open the back cover to install the SIM card, an optional memory card, and replace the battery.



- Remove the back cover using the slot on the top left of your device.
- 2. Lift the cover up and to the right of the device.

Warning: Do not bend or twist the back cover excessively. Doing so may damage the cover.

Install the SIM Card

If your device supports a SIM cards, follow these instructions to install it.

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a SIM card. You may be able to use your previous SIM card. Contact your service provider for more details.

Warning: Small components such as SIM cards can pose a choking risk. Please be careful when handling these cards to avoid damaging them.

Note: The SIM card slot is located below the memory card slot.



► Carefully slide the SIM card into the SIM card slot with the gold contacts facing down as shown.

Install a Memory Card

You can also install an optional microSD™ memory card (not included) to add more memory space to your device. A memory card can be installed at any time. It is not necessary to install it prior to using the device.



 Carefully slide the memory card into the memory card slot with the gold contacts facing down as shown.

Install the Battery

You can install a replacement battery.



- Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the device, making sure the connectors align.
- 2. Gently press down to secure the battery.

Replace the Back Cover

Close the back cover before using the device.



- 1. Place the back cover onto the back of the device.
- Press down from the middle of the back cover to the edges.
- Press along the edges of the back cover until you have a secure seal.

Note: Your device is IP68 rated for dust and water resistance. To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure that the SIM card/Memory card tray openings are maintained free of dust and water, and the tray is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids. For more information, refer to "Maintaining Water and Dust Resistance" on page 155.

Installing the Protective Case

- 1. Insert the top of the device into the case.
- 2. Press the other side of the case firmly to install it.




To remove the protective case from the device:

- Twist the top edge of the case until the device protrudes from it.
- 2. Remove the device from the case.

Charge the Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. A charging head and USB cable are included with the device for charging the battery from any standard outlet.

The battery comes partially charged. You can use the device while charging.



Caution: Use only charging devices that are approved by Samsung. Samsung accessories are designed for your device to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may void your warranty and may cause damage.

- Insert the USB cable into the USB charger/ Accessory port.
- Connect the USB cable to the charging head, and then plug the charging head into a standard outlet.
- Unplug the charging head from the outlet and remove the USB cable from the device when charging is complete.

While charging, the device and the charger may become hot. This does not affect the device's lifespan or performance and is in the device's normal range of operation.

The charger may stop charging if the battery becomes too hot.

If the device heats up while charging the battery:

- Disconnect the charger from the device and close any running apps.
- 2. Wait for the device to cool down, and then begin charging the device again.
 - If the lower part of the device overheats, check for damage to the connected USB cable.
 Replace the damaged USB cable with a new Samsung-approved cable.

Start Using Your Device

Turn Your Device On or Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your device on or off.

To turn the device on:

 Press and hold the Power key until the device turns on.

To turn the device off:

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** key.
- 2. Tap **Power off**, and confirm when prompted.

Use the Setup Wizard

The first time you turn your device on, the Setup Wizard guides you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, connect to a Wi-Fi® network, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

Lock or Unlock Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device. By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out.

To lock the device:

Press the Power key.

The default Screen lock on your device is Swipe. To choose a secure screen lock, see <u>"Set a Secure Screen Lock" on page 129</u>.

To unlock the device:

Press the Power key or Home key, and then drag your finger across the screen.

Add a Google Account

Your new device uses your Google™ Account to fully utilize its features.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap
 Settings > Cloud and accounts > Accounts.
- 3. Tap + Add account > Google.

Add a Samsung Account

Create a Samsung account for access to Samsung content and apps on your device.

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Cloud and accounts > Accounts.
- 3. Tap + Add account > Samsung account.

Add an Email Account


View and manage all of your email accounts.

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap
 Settings > Cloud and accounts > Accounts.
- 3. Tap (+) Add account > Email.

S Pen

The S Pen is a stylus that assists you in performing various functions.

Remove S Pen

The S Pen stores inside the protective cover for convenient access.

► Pull the S Pen out of the slot using the notch on its end.

Replace the S Pen Tip

Replace the tip of the S Pen with the included kit.



- 1. Use tweezers to pull out the S Pen tip.
- Insert the new S Pen tip and press until it clicks in place.

Learn About Your Device

Navigation

Learn the basics for navigating through your device.

Touchscreen Navigation

Please note that a touchscreen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a capacitive stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object on the touchscreen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty.

Tap

Lightly tap items to select or launch them.

- Tap the keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Tap an item to select it.
- Tap an app shortcut to launch the application.

Double-Tap

Lightly tap items twice to select or launch them.

• Double-tap an image to zoom in or out.

Touch and Hold

Touch and hold items on the screen to activate them.

 Touch and hold a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Swipe

Lightly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

- Swipe the screen to unlock the device.
- Swipe the screen to scroll through the Home screens or menu options.

Drag

Touch and hold an item, and then move it to a new location.

- Drag an app shortcut to add it to a Home screen.
- Drag a widget to place it in a new location on a Home screen.

Pinch and Spread

Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger or spread by moving your fingers apart.

- Pinch the screen to zoom out while viewing a picture or a web page.
- Spread your fingers on the screen to zoom in while viewing a picture or a web page.

Common Options

Many of the following common options are usually available on various screens:

- More options: Tap to view more menu options for a screen. This often allows you to select items to delete or share.
- Til Delete: Tap to select items to delete.
- **Share**: Tap to select items to share, and then choose a sharing method.
- CEdit: Tap to customize the screen.
- On/Off: Tap to turn the option on () or off ().
- **Menu**: Tap to view available options for the field.

Customize Your Home Screen

Screens

Your device comes with multiple Home screens to hold app shortcuts and widgets. You can add, remove, change the order of screens, as well as choose a different main Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Use these options to manage screens:
 - To align shortcuts into a line at the top of a screen, tap Align top.
 - To align shortcuts into a line at the bottom of a screen, tap Align bottom.
 - To remove a Home screen, tap **III Remove**.
 - To set a screen as the main Home screen, tap
 Main. This screen is displayed when you
 press the Home key.

- To change the order of screens, touch and hold a screen, and then drag it to a new position.
- To add a screen, swipe to the end of the screens, and then tap — Add.
- To find the Bixby home screen, swipe to the left of the screens. To activate this feature, tap On/Off at the top of the screen.

App Shortcuts

You can use app shortcuts to launch an app from any Home screen.

To add a shortcut:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold an app shortcut to open the options menu.
- 3. Tap Add shortcut to Home.

To remove a shortcut:

Touch and hold an app shortcut to open the options menu.

2. Tap **Remove shortcut**.

 Removing a shortcut does not delete the app, it just removes the shortcut from a Home screen.

To move a shortcut from one Home screen to another:

- 1. Touch and hold an app shortcut to release it.
- Drag the app shortcut to a new Home screen, and then release it.

Use Folders

You can organize App shortcuts in folders on an Apps list screen and Home screen.

For more information, see <u>"Create and Use Folders" on page 43</u>.

Wallpapers

Change the look of the Home and Lock screens with wallpaper. You can display a favorite picture or choose from preloaded wallpapers.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Wallpapers to customize.
- Tap From Gallery to see additional wallpaper images.
- 4. Tap an image to choose it, and then select which screen you want to use it for.
- 5. Tap **Set as wallpaper**.

Widgets

Widgets are simple application extensions that run on a Home screen.

To add a widget to a Home screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- Touch and hold a widget, drag it to a Home screen, and release it.

To remove a widget from a Home screen:


- From a Home screen, touch and hold a widget to open the options menu.
- 2. Tap Til Remove.

Home Screen Settings

Customize your Home screens and Apps screens.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap **Home screen settings** to customize:
 - Home screen layout: Set your device to have a Home and Apps screen, or only a Home screen where all apps are located.
 - Apps button: Add an apps button to the Home screen for easy access to the Apps screen.
 - Quick-open notification panel: Enable this feature to open the Notification panel from a Home screen by swiping down.
 - **Hide apps**: Select apps to hide.
 - About Home screen: View version information.

Notification Panel

View the Notification Panel

You can access the Notification panel from any screen.

- 1. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
 - To open an item, tap it.
 - To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right.
 - To clear all notifications, tap Clear all.
- Drag upward from the bottom of the screen or tap
 Back to close the Notification panel.

Quick Settings

The Notification panel provides quick access to device functions, allowing you to quickly turn them on or off.

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- Drag == View all downward.
 - Tap a setting to turn it on or off.
 - Tap More options to reorder Quick settings or to change the button layout.
- 3. Drag = View all upward to close Quick settings.

S Pen Functions

The S Pen provides a variety of helpful functions.

Air View

Hover the S Pen over the screen to preview content or view information about an item on the screen. The following Air view features are available:

- Preview an email message before opening it.
- Preview the contents of a photo album or enlarge a picture.
- Preview a video and navigate to a specific scene by hovering over the timeline.
- View the name or description of an icon or a button.

Note: The preview function is only available when the S Pen's on-screen pointer is a solid color.

Direct Pen Input

When entering text, you can open a Handwriting window that allows you to write with the S Pen.

To use the Handwriting window:

- Hover the S Pen over a text field until
 Handwriting is displayed.
- Tap Handwriting. The Handwriting window is displayed.
- Use the space provided in the window to write an entry by hand using the S Pen. While writing, your entries are converted into text.
 - To edit the converted text, use the Space, Delete, and Enter icons.
 - To change the position of the cursor, drag the pointer below the cursor to the desired position for editing.

Configure S Pen Settings

To configure S Pen settings:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > S Pen to configure the following settings:

General

- Air view: Turn Air view on or off. Select options for Air view and customize.
- **Direct pen input**: Turn the Direct pen input feature on or off
- Pointer: Turn the pointer on or off. The pointer appears on the screen when the tip of the S Pen is near the screen, showing available actions.
- Screen off memo: Create Screen off memos by detaching the S Pen while the screen is turned off and then writing on the screen. Screen off memos are saved in S Note.

Air Command

- **Shortcuts**: Configure the Air command menu with S Pen features, apps, and functions.
- **Floating icon**: Show an Air command icon that you can move around the screen.

Feedback

 Sound: Set your device to make sounds when the S Pen is attached and detached, and when writing on the screen.

Other

- Learn about S Pen features: View a tutorial for the Glance feature.
- About S Pen: View version information for the S Pen features.

Air Command

To launch the Air command menu:

Tap Air command.

- or -

Hold the S Pen near the screen so that the pointer appears, and then press the **S Pen** button once.

- 2. Tap an option:
 - Degree Create note: Launch a new note in the Samsung Notes app.
 - [i] View all notes: Launch the Samsung Notes
 app and view a listing of the note you have
 created.
 - **(ii) Smart select**: Draw around an area of the screen to collect it in the Gallery app.
 - Screen write: Capture screenshots and write or draw on them.

- PEN.UP: Launch the PEN.UP app to share and view S Pen creations. For more information, see "PEN.UP" on page 88.
- **Add shortcuts**: Add more apps or functions to the Air command menu.
- Settings: Customize Air command by configuring apps and functions, and by changing how the Air command menu appears.

Create Note

Launch a new note directly in the Samsung Notes app. For more information, see <u>"Samsung Notes" on page 84</u>.

Smart Select

Capture content on any screen to add it to the Gallery or share it through Contacts.

- Tap Air command > (ii) Smart select.
- Tap a shape at the top of the screen, and then drag a box with the S Pen to select content. The following options appear:
 - Auto select: Allow Smart select to automatically select content to extract.
 - Extracted text: Identify and extract text from the selected content.
 - Pin to screen: Place a shortcut to the collected content on a Home screen.
 - Draw: Draw on the captured content.
 - Share: Choose a sharing method to share your content.
- 3. Tap **Save**. The content is saved to the Gallery app.

Screen Write

Capture screenshots and write or draw on them.

- I. Tap 🕢 Air command > 🙆 Screen write.
- The current screen is captured, and a pen tool appears. The following editing tools are provided:
 - Pen: Draw on the screenshot. Press the Pen icon a second time to change the pen tip, size, and color, and to save presets.
 - Eraser: Erase the writing or drawings on the screenshot. Tap the Eraser icon a second time for additional options, including Erase all.
 - Undo: Reverse the last action.
 - Redo: Repeat the last action that was undone.
 - **Crop**: Crop the captured content.
 - Share: Choose a sharing method to share your content.
- 3. Tap **Save**. The content is saved to the Gallery app.

Add Shortcuts

You can customize the Air command menu by adding shortcuts to apps and functions.

To use Add shortcuts:

- Tap Air command > Add shortcuts.
- 2. Tap the apps or functions you would like to add to the Air command menu.
 - To remove an app shortcut, tap **Remove**.
- 3. Tap **Back** to save your selection.

Face Recognition

Use face recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can set the device to use Face Recognition to unlock the screen by recognizing your face.

Register a Face

To use your face to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Face recognition.
- 3. Follow the prompts to register your face.

Face Recognition

Customize how face recognition works.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Face recognition for the following options:
 - Remove face data: Delete existing faces.
 - Samsung Pass: Access your online accounts using face recognition.
 - Face unlock: Tap On/Off to enable or disable face recognition security.
 - Face unlock when screen turns on: Unlock your device with face recognition as soon as the screen turns on.
 - Faster recognition: Turn on for faster face recognition. Turn off to increase security and make it harder to unlock using an image or video of your likeness.

Fingerprint Scanner

Use fingerprint recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can also use your fingerprint to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account.

Register a Fingerprint

To use your fingerprint to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password. You can register up to three fingerprints.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Fingerprint scanner.
- 3. Follow the prompts to register your fingerprint.

Fingerprint Management

Add, delete, and rename fingerprints.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Fingerprint scanner for the following options:
 - To rename a fingerprint, tap the fingerprint, enter a new name, and then tap Rename.
 - To add a fingerprint, tap + Add fingerprint and follow the prompts to register a fingerprint.
 - To delete a fingerprint, touch and hold the fingerprint, and then tap Remove. Confirm when prompted.

Fingerprint Verification


Use fingerprint recognition to verify your identity in supported apps and actions.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Fingerprint scanner for the following options:
 - **Samsung Pass**: Access your online accounts using your fingerprint.
 - Fingerprint unlock: Tap On/Off to enable or disable fingerprint security.

Multi Window

Multitask by using two applications at the same time. Apps that support Multi window™ can be displayed together on a split screen. You can switch between the apps and adjust the sizes of their windows.

- From any screen, touch and hold Recent apps.
- Tap Multi window in the title bar to launch an application in split screen view.
 - Recently opened apps are displayed in the lower window. Apps that support Multi window have the Multi window icon in their title bar.
 - If there are no recently opened apps that support Multi window, or if you want to launch a different app, tap App list.
- Tap an app in the lower window to add it to the split screen view.



Window Controls

The Window controls modify the way apps windows are displayed in split screen view.

- ► Tap the middle of the window border to display the following options:
 - Switch windows: Swap the two windows.
 - Open in pop-up view: Open the selected app in a pop-up window.
 - Close app: Close the selected app.

Multi Window Settings


Additional features are available for Multi window.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features >
 Multi window, and then tap On/Off to enable
 each of the following options:

 - Pop-up view action: Swipe down diagonally from either the right or left top corner of the screen to put the app into pop-up view.

Enter Text

Text can be entered using either an on-screen keyboard or your voice.



- ▶ Tap a text field to display the Samsung keyboard.
 - Tap Symbol to insert symbols.
 - Touch and hold Control for quick access to cut (x), copy (c), paste (v), undo (z), redo (y), and select all (a).

Option Keys

Use these special keys when entering text.

- From the Samsung keyboard, touch and hold the Options key for the following:
 - Voice input: Enter text using Google Voice™ typing.
 - Handwriting: Use your handwriting to enter text.
 - Eipboard: Access the clipboard.
 - © **Emoticon**: Insert an emoticon.
 - **EXECUTE:** Change the layout of the keyboard.
 - Keyboard settings: Access keyboard settings.

Note: The Options key displays the last option used.

Configure the Samsung Keyboard


Set customized options for the Samsung keyboard.

- 1. From the Samsung keyboard, touch and hold **Options**.
- 2. Tap **Keyboard settings** for options:
 - Languages and types: Set the keyboard type and choose which languages are available on the keyboard.
 - To switch between languages, slide the Space bar sideways.
 - Smart typing: Use predictive text and auto-correction features to prevent common typing mistakes. Type by swiping between letters.

- Customization: Use alternative characters, text shortcuts, change the keyboard size, or use a high contrast keyboard.
- Other settings: Reset keyboard settings, clear personalized data, and view information about the Samsung keyboard.

Use Google Voice Typing

Instead of typing, enter text by speaking.



- 1. From the Samsung keyboard, tap 🕑 **Voice input**.
- 2. Tap the screen and speak your text.

Configure Google Voice Typing

Set customized options for Google Voice typing.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > General management >
 Language and input > On-screen keyboard >
 Google voice typing.
 - Languages: Select languages for Google voice typing.
 - "Ok Google" detection: Launch a Google search whenever you say "OK Google".
 - Hands-free: Allow requests with the device locked.
 - **Speech output**: Select options for spoken feedback.
 - Offline speech recognition: Download and install speech recognition engines, allowing you to use voice input while not connected to the network.

- Block offensive words: Hide search results that contain offensive words.
- Bluetooth headset: Use audio input from a Bluetooth® headset (not included) if one is connected.

Apps

Learn how to change the way apps are displayed, organize apps into folders, and install, uninstall, or disable apps.

Use Apps

The Apps list displays all preloaded and downloaded apps. You can uninstall, disable, or hide apps from view.

Access Apps

Access and launch all applications from the Apps list.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap an app's shortcut to launch it.
 - To return to the main Home screen, press the Home key.

Add an Apps Shortcut

In addition to swiping to access apps, you can add an Apps button to the Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap More options > Settings > Apps button.
- 3. Tap Show Apps button > Apply.

Galaxy Essentials

View and download Samsung apps that are optimized for use with Galaxy devices.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap More options > Galaxy Essentials.

Uninstall or Disable Apps

Uninstall or disable apps you download and install.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold an app to open the options menu.
 - To uninstall an app, tap **Uninstall**.
 - To disable an app, tap **Disable**.

Note: Some preloaded apps can only be disabled, not uninstalled. Apps that are disabled are turned off and hidden from view.

Sort Apps

App shortcuts can be listed alphabetically or in your own custom order.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap More options > Sort.
 - Alphabetical order: Sort apps alphabetically.
 - **Custom order**: Arrange apps manually.
 - To remove empty spaces between apps, tap
 More options > Clean up pages.

Create and Use Folders

Create a folder to organize App shortcuts on an Apps list screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold an app shortcut, and then drag it on top of another app shortcut until it is highlighted.
- 3. Release the app shortcut to create the folder.
 - Enter folder name: Name the folder.
 - **Palette**: Change the folder color.
 - Add apps: Place more apps in the folder.
 Tap apps to select them, and then tap Add.
- 4. Tap **Back** to close the folder.

Copy a Folder to a Home Screen

Create a folder and copy it to a Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold a folder, and then drag it to the top or bottom of the screen.
- 3. Drag the folder to the desired location on the Home screen, and then release it.

Delete a Folder

When you delete a folder, the app shortcuts are returned to the Apps list screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold a folder to delete.
- 3. Tap **Delete folder**, and confirm when prompted.

Apps Settings

Manage your downloaded and preloaded apps.

Device Maintenance

 - **Unmonitored apps**: Select apps to exclude from being put to sleep by the App power monitor.

- Always sleeping apps: Select apps that will be put to sleep immediately when they are not being used.
 - More options > Advanced settings: Configure advanced battery settings and notifications.

Storage

View the device memory and usage. Mount, unmount, or format an optional memory card (not included).

Device Memory

View and manage the memory used by the device.
